
Events are listed in *Chronological Order*.

**27 JAN 1991:** The Score to the *Academy-Award* nominated short, "**12:01 PM**", was recorded at *Evergreen Studio* in Los Angeles.





1991: In that same year, a 2-hour Musical, "SON of the STORM", was composed.





"A Theme for Special Olympics" TRAILER

On the Same Date of **27 JAN, but in 1978**, the young adult novel, "**Only for Now**", was written.

This work became a 9-movement suite for extended Wind & Jazz Ensembles. It was premiered at MIT in May of 1980.

From the Suite came my first piece for band, "A Theme for the Special Olympics." In 2020, it was made the Official Theme of the Special Olympics by the Special Olympics Committee.

1991: I was in Arizona on a film project called **Benefit of the Doubt**. In the photo is the jacket given to me by Actress, Amy Irving. "Never Had a Love Like You Before", composed for Amy's character, became part of the end credits.



On **27 JAN 1992**, (yes, that same date) came the formal start of **STORMWORKS**. All **335** movements (**7600** pages of score) are commissioned by Conductors throughout the world. From "**Son of the Storm**" came the complete body of work known as **Stormworks**, now over **46 hours** of Music. **Stormworks** was/is the **FIRST** Self-publishing entity in the Music Education World.



**1992:** Symphony Number Numberless: S-Matrix premiered with The North Carolina Symphony Orchestra, Gerhardt Zimmermann Conducting. This work received the first-ever standing ovation in the 40 year history of The Meymandi Memorial Auditorium in Raleigh on 19 NOV 1992.

# Symphony shines with, without Meyers

ALEIGH — Anne Akiko Meyers stepped to center stage Thursday night for an N.C. Symphony concert at Memorial Auditorium looking like a million dollars — and she played like a million dollars, too.

Absolutely riveting in a slim. strapless, full-length red satin gown, Meyers made her violin weep in a smooth-as-silk yet dramatic Prokofiev Concerto No. 2 in G major, Opus 63. Her big, vibrant Stradivarius sound could turn into a kitten's purr in a nanosecond in this concerto, with its astringent sonorities and angular arpeggiated figures juxtaposed with quiet interludes. A worldclass violinist in a late 20th-century concert world of outstanding artists, she conquered Prokofiev's uncompromising piece with im-

peccable craftsmanship and musicianship.

Overall, this was an exceptional night for the symphony. Maestro Gerhardt Zimmermann announced before the first number (a world premiere) that it was chosen from some 300 others solicited from across the country. The composer, Stephen Melillo of Connecticut, had written 630 compositions before this one but "had never before had a piece performed by a major orchestra," according to the program notes.

His "S. Matrix" Symphony was fabulous, full of childlike wonderment (as the composer intended) and marvelous sounds. And they worked to maximum effect — a brilliant original use of orchestral resources for a sophisticated, sensational, beautiful and satisfying experience.

Shimmering bowed gong and a number of other intriguing sounds (the origins of which were sometimes unidentifiable from my vantage point) alternated with passages of rich strings speaking as one voice in a kind of Greek chorus that returned time and again in tones of peace and serenity.


The final movement was something like what a child's imagination might conjure up on a trip to another galaxy, particularly when three percussionists started swinging flexible tubes in circles, making them "sing" at different pitches. But always there was a return to a central core of rich strings, like a comfort zone from which the listener (the child in us) darts out to confront the unknown and the unimaginable.

Long, sustained applause drew the composer on stage for bows afterward.

But that wasn't all: Zimmermann and the orchestra offered an excellent performance of Mendelssohn's "Scottish" Symphony (No.'3 in A minor, Opus 56), dedicated to the late Patricia R. Hackney, former president of the symphony board.


For best effect, the Mendelssohn demands a high level of performance on the part of the conductor and musicians, and, with the newly upgraded standard of the French horn section (and new first horn player), the players were fully up to the challenge.

Someone down the line of horns lip-faulted a few times, but the ensemble was tremendously improved, with added sheen from the definitive first horn. Unfortunately for those sitting toward stage right, some clod had the nerve to start snapping pictures (and his camera had a loud shutter). The most delicate, quiet passages were rudely interrupted, but Zimmermann and team brought the work to a close for a performance that was otherwise first class.







**2006:** Chapter 1-Prime: a Wish to the World & the Premiere of LAST WORLD STANDING. (An Innovation in multi-media, pioneering PhotoRHYTHM™ & VISAReel™. At its premiere, this 33-minute work brought an **18-minute Standing ovation** in The Brucknerhaus, Linz, Austria.)



**2007:** The **DVD** versions of **Kakehashi: That We Might Live & Last World Standing**. (The DVD of **That We Might Live** was sent to 17 Senators and Congressmen. Several of the ex-POWS were summarily awarded **Bronze Stars** and **Purple Hearts** as a result of this **Music changing the world**.)



# Christmas-themed piece wins best epic/orchestral composition

Smithfield composer Stephen Melillo spent the evening of Nov. 16 at a friend's home eating dinner, and trying very hard to resist the urge to check Facebook to see who'd been nominated for the 65th Grammy

He'd been hoping to see his album, "The Grey II-III," a and lyricist Cindy Paulos in the 142-minute collection of instrumental compositions, listed among the nominees. It was a long shot, but "I prayed anyway," Melillo said.

After tossing and turning in bed, he finally broke down at 1:23 a.m. the next morning and checked his phone.

As he'd expected, "The Grey there was an unexpected message waiting for him from 2021 Grammy-winner Danaë Vlasse.

"I'm at the HMMAs - congratulations my friend - you Paulos did. and Cindy won!" the message

The Hollywood Music in Media Awards, or HMMAs, serves as a red-carpet event honoring original music in film, televi-

sion, video cames and other visual media across the globe. Among this year's winners were "Lift Me Up," performed by Rihanna for the blockbuster movie "Black Panther: Wakanda Forever," in the category of best feature film song; Simon Frangien's "Avatar: Way of The Water" for best fantasy film score; and "Reprise from Love Conquers All" by Meltilo category of best epic/orchestral genre composition.

Paulos, a music producer and longtime announcer for radio stations in Hawati and Arizona. had approached Melillo in 2000. to write music for her album. "In the Hands of God." "Reprise from Love Conquers All" is the 10th of 11 songs included in the Il-III" wasn't nominated, but duo's second joint album, titled "Love Conquers All, When Heaven Merges With Earth."

Melillo, originally from Port Chester, New York, attributes his interest in instrumental compositions to his teenage years when he first heard Austrian composer Gustav Mahler's

"I listened to a 20-minute excerpt from his 10th symphony 100 times without stopping. Play, rewind; play, rewind," Melillo said. "Years later, I did the math. I had listened for 33.33 hours. His music had a profound

He took up writing his own music in high school, publishing his first composition with Bourne Music Publishers in the early 1990s. By 1992 he'd founded his self-publishing entity Stormworks. His now more than 1,320 works include four symphonies and 15 film scores, including the 1990 Academy Award-nominated "12:01 P.M. He's also the author of several novels, including "Ahab, a Love Story," intended as a prequel to Herman Melville's "Moby Dick," and a sequel titled Death to Moby Dick, a Love

Melillo relocated to Smithfield in 1994 to work with the Langley Air Force Band, which had commissioned a composition titled "David."
